



How to Become a State Delegate



Attending a caucus and running to be a delegate at the state assembly can be an immense help to Michael Allen, and it's a great way to get involved in your community. Caucus and assembly can be intimidating if you've never attended, so this guide explains the ins-and-outs of the process so you are comfortable and prepared to support Michael Allen for Attorney General.

What Is a Caucus?

Caucuses are meetings of registered electors in a precinct who are members of the Republican Party. These are your neighbors who are part of your party. The purpose of a caucus is to elect precinct committee persons and delegates to county, district, and state assemblies. Some counties elect delegates to county and state assemblies at the caucus, and some elect state assembly delegates at the county assembly. We hope you will be a delegate for both the county and state assembly. The state assembly is where we will nominate Michael Allen to become the Republican candidate to beat Jena Griswold in the general election.

What Is Assembly?

Assembly is a meeting for all delegates who were elected at the caucus.

Caucus → State Assembly



1. Attend Your GOP Precinct Caucus.

Caucus will be held on one day between March 3–7. You should [contact your county party](#) to find your precinct's caucus location. Again, these are meetings of Republicans in your neighborhood. When you attend, please check in with the organizer and find your specific precinct table or room.



2. Become a Delegate.

During the caucus meeting, you will express your desire to be a delegate and attend the state assembly in support of Michael Allen. You may need to persuade your neighbors why they should choose you to be a delegate and why Michael Allen is the best choice for Colorado Attorney General. You may also read the caucus letter from Michael Allen, if you prefer.

To be a delegate at the state assembly, you may need to be elected as a delegate at the county assembly as well. Some counties elect state assembly delegates at the county assembly while others elect state delegates at caucus.



3. Pay Badge Fees.

After you've been elected as a delegate, you will need to provide payment for your badge fees.



4. Become a State Delegate at County Assembly, if Necessary.

If your county elects state assembly delegates at the county assembly, you may need to become a state assembly delegate at the county assembly. [Click here](#) to find the date and location of your county party assembly.



5. Support Michael Allen at State Assembly!

The state assembly will be on **April 11 at the Massari Arena at CSU Pueblo**. When you attend the state assembly, you will check in with your county organizer and take a seat with your fellow delegates. Candidates will have the opportunity to speak at the assembly before a vote is taken for statewide offices. You will be voting to place Michael Allen's name on the ballot for the June 30, 2026, Republican Primary Election.

Remember!

You **must be a registered Republican** to attend the caucus and vote for Michael Allen at the state assembly.

- To be eligible to vote in a Republican precinct caucus, **you must meet all of these requirements:**
 - A resident of the precinct for at least 22 days
 - Registered to vote no later than 22 days before the caucus
 - Affiliated with the Republican Party holding the caucus for at least 22 days before the caucus
- Anyone who turns 18 or becomes a naturalized citizen less than 22 days before the Republican Party's caucus may still participate if they are registered to affiliate with the Republican Party.
- A pre-registrant who is seventeen years of age on the date of a caucus and who will be eighteen years of age on the date of the next general election may vote at the caucus.
- You will need a government-issued ID to check in for caucus and assembly. This is to verify you are a resident of your precinct for caucus and assembly.
- You may be elected as an alternate instead of a delegate. Please attend the assembly regardless of your designation. Your vote and your voice can change the minds of delegates, and you may be elected as a delegate for a later assembly.
- Please take a picture of the paperwork at the caucus or assembly where you are elected a delegate as proof you were made a delegate. Please be sure to bring that to the assemblies. There are often issues and concerns with the eligibility of delegates and alternates to vote. You will make verification easier if you have proof of the paperwork that made you a delegate.
